# Paese storico della Ciociaria: CASTELNUOVO PARANO

Uno dei piu' piccoli paesi della Ciociaria, Castelnuovo Parano, fu fondato nel 1065 dall' Abate Desiderio (poi Papa Vittore III) per difendere Montecassino dalle incursioni di Traetto ed Ausonia. Esso sorge alle estreme propaggini meridionali della provincia di Frosinone, tanto che in passato segnò il confine tra i possedimenti dell'Abbazia di Montecassino ed il Ducato di Gaeta.

La sua storia, segnata dalle lotte del Papato con i Normanni e gli Svevi, vede anche un infruttuoso tentativo di rendersi autonoma dall'Abbazia (XII sec.). Passò poi nel 1421 tra i domini del Conte di Fondi, poi del Re di Napoli Ferrante D'Aragona, del principe di Stigliano ed infine venne inglobato nel Ducato di Traetto.


Deriva il suo nome da "Castel Nuovo delle Fratte" (Fratte è l'odierna Ausonia), unito a Parano, il luogo dove fu fatto costruire il Castello, e cioè sul Monte Perano. Il paese diviene assai vivace soprattutto nel periodo estivo. Lasciato Castelnuovo si scende verso il più antico e il più moderno dei suoi casali: S. Antonio Abate o Valli.

Casale più antico perché qui, immediatamente sotto il livello stradale, sorge la chiesa di S. Antonio Abate; e il più moderno perché questa frazione si sta sviluppando notevolmente con case, attività commerciali e industriali. Castelnuovo Parano fa parte con le limitrofe Ausonia e Coreno Ausonio del Distretto Industriale del Marmo. Castelnuovo Parano può essere base per escursioni sul Monte Calvo.

Abitanti: 875; Altitudine: 334 m. s.l.m.; Distanza da Frosinone: 70 Km. a S.E. Piatti tipici: come nella maggioranza della Ciociaria.

One of the smallest towns in Ciociaria, Castelnuovo Parano was founded in 1065 by the Abbot Desiderius (later Pope Victor III) to defend Montecassino from the raids of Traetto and Ausonia. The town stands on the southern reaches of the province of Frosinone and once marked the boundary between the possessions of the Abbey of Montecassino and the Duchy of Gaeta.

Its history marked by the struggles of the papacy with the



Normans and the Swabians, also sees an unsuccessful attempt to become independent from the Abbey (XII Cent.). In 1421 it fell under the domains of the Count of Fondi, then the King of Naples Ferrante of Aragon, the Prince of Stigliano and finally was incorporated into the Duchy of Traetto.

It derives its name from "Castel Nuovo delle Fratte" (Fratte being modern day Ausonia), joined to Parano, the place where the castle was built, namely Mount Perano. The town becomes very lively especially during the summer. Leaving Castelnuovo the road goes down to the oldest and the most modern of its hamlets: S. Antonio Abate o Valli, respectively.

The oldest because, just below road level, stands the church of St. Anthony the Abbot; and the most modern because this fraction is developing profusely with new houses, commercial and industrial activities. Castelnuovo Parano with neighboring Ausonia and Coreno Ausonio is part of the Industrial District of Marmo (marble). Castelnuovo Parano can be a base for excursions on Mountain Calvo.

Population: 875; Elevation: 334 m. a.s.l.; Distance from Frosinone: 70 Km. (S.E.); Cuisine: as in the majority of Ciociaria.



#### **MEMBERS HONOURED IN MICHIGAN**

Angela and Luigi LaMarra are being honoured as the 2019 Humanitarians of the Year by the Columbus Day Celebration Committee. They will receive their award in Lansing on Tuesday, Oct 8 and at the Columbus Day Banquet on Sunday Oct. 13 at the Italian American Cultural Center in Clinton Twp. Founders of the Coro Italiano, Luigi and his wife Angela were born in Portella S. Elia Fiume Rapido, (FR), he on April 26, 1927 and she on October 25, 1932. They married in 1953 and in December 1955 came to the United States with their two sons. They eventually had 2 more sons. Luigi began working in construction, as an inspector of automotive parts and at Chrysler. But due to a couple of serious accidents he was involved in, he became disabled.

Luigi had musical knowledge of the clarinet and Angela had a beautiful voice, so they formed the ISCA Coro Italiano (Gruppo Folcloristico) in 1985. They participated in all types of occasions and functions. Over the years, they have performed at many parties, church celebrations, nursing homes, at the State Capitol in Lansing and in Windsor. Their music includes songs in all dialects and from every part of Italy. They have been an important part of the Italian Cultural Society by preserving the culture of the music of the Italian people.

Luigi is a member of the Reduci e Combattenti, the Italian Cultural Center of Milwaukee, the Lazio Club, the Sons of Italy and the Italian American Cultural Center.

Both Luigi and Angela are members of the Ciociaro Club of Windsor!! Congratulations!!!

# ITALIAN HERITAGE LANGUAGE ALIVE AND WELL AT CIOCIARO

The following is a preface by Silvio Puzzuoli and his letter to the editor of "Panoranaitalia" magazine in response to articles about teaching Italian to our young generation.

"The letter was written to Mr. ADAM ZARA, the editor of PANORAMITALIA, a magazine that has readership all over CANADA.

My letter was a response to two separate articles featured in their magazine regarding the problems encountered in teaching Italian to our young and what can be done to surmount the lack of funds, the low interest by the students, as well as community and lack of financial support.

Basically, the letter points out what we did in WINDSOR, with the help of the clubs, the University of Windsor, and a small group of dedicated people, to revamp Italian credit courses for high school students. This is the fifth year that the courses are being taught, one evening per week, at the Ciociaro Club."

Egregio Editore,

Ho letto con interesse ed emozione gli articoli "insegnare l'italiano ai nostri giovani " come " rimbocchiamoci le maniche".Con questo, vorrei spiegare la nostra situazione a Windsor e la Contea d'Essex.

Gia' nel 2013, le nostre scuole secondarie cattoliche e pubbliche non avevano piu' studenti che s'iscrivevano ai corsi d'italiano. I problemi erano duplici: studenti disinteressati alla lingua italiana e studenti che volevano frquentarla ma non avevano lo spazio nel loro orario giornaliero.

#### Che abbiamo fatto?

Tramite l'universita' di Windsor, e l'appoggio dei circoli/clubs italiani, abbiamo creato un corso (AQ additional qualifications Part 1) approvato dal ministro della pubblica istruzione ed insegnato via internet. Questo corso, poteva essere solamente frequentato da insegnanti gia' diplomati e che avevano vari corsi universitari d'italiano e la ovvia passione d'insegnare l'italiano.

Hanno seguito questo corso insegnanti da Ottawa, Toronto, Hamilton e Windsor. Cosi, ci siamo assicurati di avere insegnanti disponibili per la nostra situazione.

Dopo questo, abbiamo fatto delle presentazioni al consiglio scolastico (WECDSB) e hanno deciso che potevamo fare

publicita' ed avendo abbastanza studenti ,iniziare le classi dopo la giornata scolastica. Nel nostro caso, gli studenti grado 9,10 11, 12 vengono da varie scuole secondarie. Cominciamo nella meta' di ottobre e finiamo alla fine di maggio, una sera ogni settimana (6-9pm) offrendo novanta ore d'istruzione per ottenere il valore (credit) verso il diploma.

Per i nostri corsi, usiamo la sede del Ciociaro club di Windsor e dovrei dire che sono gia' quattro anni che offriamo questi corsi ed il numero di studenti aumenta annualmente- quest'anno abbiamo sessanta studenti grado:10, 11, 12.



#### Crescenzo della Gamba

Crescenzo della Gamba, pittore attivo dal 1749 al 1783, era un pittore italiano nato a Napoli, il quale esercitava le sue doti da pittore – moderno barroccano - anche a Castelnuovo Parano. Il suo stile fu influenzato da Francesco Solimena. Egli pitturo' il soffitto del Teatrino della Corte, illustrando Apollo ammazza il serpent nel palazzo di Caserta. Ancora in Caserta, egli si esibi' con Gaetano Magri. Un'altra sua opera, fu la pittura del soffitto di San Pietro in Vincoli a Napoli.

Da notare: non e' stato possibile trovare altre informazioni riguardanti questo artista.

Crescenzo della Gamba (active 1749 -1783) was an Italian painter, active in Naples in a late-Baroque style. His style is influenced by Francesco Solimena. He painted the ceiling of the Teatrino della Corte, depicting Apollo kills the Serpent in the Palace of Caserta. Also in Caserta, he worked alongside Gaetano Magri. He painted the ceiling of the church of San Pietro in Vincoli in Naples.

Please note: unable to find any other information regarding this artist.

#### **PUMPKIN CHEESECAKE**

#### **Ingredients - CRUST**

1-3/4 cups graham cracker crumbs 3 tablespoons light brown sugar 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon 1 stick melted butter

#### **Directions**

Preheat oven to 350° F. In a medium bowl, combine crumbs. sugar and cinnamon. Add melted butter. Press down flat into a 9-inch springform pan. Set aside.

#### **Ingredients - Filling**

3 (8-ounce packages cream cheese at room temperature)

1 (15 ounce) can puréed pumpkin 3 eggs plus 1 egg yolk

1/4 cup sour cream

1-1/2 cups sugar

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/8 teaspoon fresh ground nutmeg

1/8 teaspoon fresh ground cloves

2 tablespoons all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon vanilla extract



#### **Directions**

Beat cream cheese until smooth. Add pumpkin puree, eggs, egg yolk, sour cream, sugar and the spices. Add flour and vanilla. Beat together until well combined.

Pour into crust. Spread out evenly and place in oven for 1 hour. Remove from oven and let sit for 15 minutes. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for 4 hours.
