VIA CRUCIS/STATIONS OF THE CROSS - APRIL 19, 2019

Even cold, windy and overcast weather could not stop the Via Crucis from being held outdoors!

The devotees of S. Gerardo and the entire cast, under the direction of Maria Di Gioia, re-enacted the Passion of Jesus Christ, His agony and death on the Cross and His burial!

It began in the Madonna di Canneto Chapel with Jesus' Last Supper. Scenes followed with His agony on the Mount of Olives, His betrayal by Judas, His arrest and interaction with Pilate, His crowning of thorns and the carrying of His cross. The way to Calvary continued outdoors with 14 stations set around the Chapel grounds. Readings were done by Maria Di Gioia and Annalisa Rossi in Italian and English, respectively. Prayers were said and songs were sung. Also, along the way, Simon of Cyrene helped Jesus carry His cross and Veronica wiped His bleeding face.

The Crucifixion and Death took place in front of the Chapel, where Maria read a beautiful passage from scripture and Jesus uttered His final words. Mary, His beloved mother, surrounded by weeping women, watched in sorrow. Jesus was then lowered from the Cross and taken to the sepulchre in the Chapel. Another beautiful passage was read by Maria, the Voci Choir sang a moving song and Jesus was laid in the tomb.

Special thanks to everyone involved with this re-enactment, no matter how big or small the part.....the S. Gerardo Devotees, the Voci Ciociare Choir, the entire cast and all the faithful people who came to remember, to participate in and to give homage to this most important event in Christianity!

From the Treasurer

Paese storico della Ciociaria: ARPINO

Arpino, dalle mitiche origini saturnie, è stata importantissima città fortificata dei Volsci, dei Sanniti e dei Romani. Lo testimoniano le imponenti mura megalitiche, dette anche ciclopiche per la grandezza dei massi con cui sono costruite; in esse si apre una originale porta a sesto acuto, unica del genere in Europa.

Nel 188 a.C. ottenne la piena cittadinanza romana e gli abitanti godettero di tutti i diritti propri dei cittadini romani. La città ampliò il territorio a nord-ovest fino a Casamari e a sud fino ad Arce. Con Caio Mario l'ager Arpinas si arricchì dai possedimenti nella Gallia, affidadogli dal famoso condottiero romano Mario Silla, anche lui nato ad Arpino. Per secoli, fin dall'alto medioevo, è stato dominio di numerosi signori prima di far parte definitivamente, dopo lunghe contese con il papato, del Regno di Napoli.

Fino all'unità d'Italia è stata fiorente per l'industria della lana. Tra le chiese ricordiamo quella di San Michele Arcangelo (sec. X), la quale conserva opere del Cavalier d'Arpino, della Scuola del Caravaggio e della Scuola toscana. Nella chiesa di Santa Maria di Civita (sec. XI) è custodita la statua lignea dell'Assunta (sec. X-XI). Particolarmente venerata dagli arpinati, viene portata in processione la mattina del 15 agosto su una monumentale "macchina" in legno dorato (sec. XVIII), opera dello Stolz. Il Monastero di S. Andrea Apostolo, uno dei più antichi monasteri di clausura benedettini della nostra zona, custodisce un antico Crocifisso a olio (sec. XVII), sotto il quale è stato rinvenuto un esemplare medioevale di croce dipinta raffigurante il "Christus triumphans", cioè il Cristo trionfante sulla morte (sec. XIV). Abitanti: 2200 ca.; Altitudine: 450m. slm; Località, 35 km. a est da Frosinone.

Piatti tipici, come nel resto della Ciociaria

Arpino, from the mythical Saturnian origins, was an important fortified city of the Volsci, Samnites and Romans.

This is reflected in the imposing megalithic walls, also known as cyclopic for the size of the boulders with which they are constructed. In them opens an original door with an ogee arch, unique of its kind in Europe.



In 188 BC it was granted full citizenship, therefore, its residents enjoyed exactly all the same rights enjoyed by Roman citizens. The city expanded its territory north-west to Casamari and south to Arce. Thanks to Caio Mario, himself born in Arpino, ager Arpinas was enriched by its possessions in Gaul. For centuries, since the high Middle Ages, it was the domain of several lords before finally joining The Kingdom of Naples, after a long contest with the papacy. Until the unification of Italy, Arpino had been thriving for its wool industry. Among the churches, we remember that of St. Michael the Archangel (X c.), which houses works by the Cavalier d'Arpino, the School of Caravaggio and the Tuscan School. In the church of Santa Maria of Civita (XI c.) is kept the wooden statue of the Assumption (X-XI c.). The statue, particularly revered by the residents of Arpino, is carried in procession in the morning of August 15 on a monumental "machine" in gilded wood (XVIII c.), the work of Stolz. The Monastery of St. Andrew the Apostle, one of the oldest cloistered Benedictine monasteries of our area, hosts an oil Crucifix (sec. XVII), under which was found a painted medieval specimen of a cross depicting the "Christus Triumphans" – the triumphant Christ over death (XIV c.).

Pop.: 2200; Elevation: 450m. asl; Location: 35 km. east of Frosinone.

Special dishes: as in the rest of Ciociaria.







Caio Mario

Caio Mario, grande condottiero romano: a sinistra, la sua statua in Arpino

Era il 156 a.C., nacque a Casamari, territorio dell'allora Arpino, da famiglia ancora legata ai duri costumi degli agricoltori latini, Mario non ebbe modo di avvicinarsi alla

cultura romana né tantomeno a quella greca. Ma il suo coraggio e le sue doti militari lo imposero all'attenzione di Scipione l'Emiliano durante il suo servizio in Spagna, che lo indicò suo degno successore. I suoi successi militari e con l'aiuto di alcuni ambienti romani gli aprirono la via alla massima carica: il consolato e, di conseguenza, al comando dell'esercito in Numidia. Con energia e rapidità la guerra fu conclusa e il capo dello sconfitto esercito avversario, fu' trasportato a Roma in catene. Per cinque volte consecutive, eccezionalmente, Mario fu rieletto Console (104 - 100 a.C.), perché Roma volle affidare al suo miglior capitano la difesa della patria contro i Teutoni e i Cimbri che ne minacciavano le frontiere. Con l'esercito da lui riformato tatticamente e socialmente, sotto l'insegna dell'Aquila, che volle simbolo delle legioni romane, i Germani furono definitivamente sconfitti. All'apogeo della sua gloria, Mario non dimenticò la sua patria d'origine e disponendo della Gallia cisalpina come terra di conquista, donò ad Arpino quei territori le cui rendite servirono a mantenere i templi e gli edifici pubblici della città. Quale uomo politico Mario non ebbe la stessa fortuna. Appoggiò il programma popolare, fu l'idolo della plebe ma, venuto a contrasto con l'aristocratico Lucio Silla, sostenne una sanguinosa lotta civile con varie vicende che lo portarono fino all'esilio in Africa. Richiamato, fu console per la settima volta. Pochi giorni dopo il conferimento del consolato Mario, colpito da febbre, morì. Era l'86 a.C. La sua statua e' situata nel paese di Arpino.

Born in Casamari, then territory of Arpino, in 156 B.C., to a family of farmers still enduring the Latin traditions, Mario never had a chance to get close to Roman, or Greek culture. His courage and his military skills were revealed to Scipione l'Emiliano during his military tour in Spain, who nominated Mario his worthy successor. With his military triumphs and with the help of several connections in Rome, he graduated to the maximum position, the Consulate, consequently put in charge of the Roman army in Numibia. With energy and rapidity the enemy was defeated and the head of the opposing army was brought to Rome in chains. Exceptionally, he was elected to Consul for five consecutive times, especially because Rome wanted his best captain to defeat the Teutons and the Cimbri, who were repeatedly threatening the borders. With an army tactically and socially reformed by Mario, under the sign of the Eagle that he wanted as symbol of the Roman legions, the Germans were definitely defeated. At the top of his glory, he never forgot his native town and being in command of cisalpine Gaul, he donated those territories, which were good sources of wealth, to Arpino, so the town was easily able to upkeep its temples and its public buildings. As a good politician he was always a person for the people, but his adversary Lucio Silla contrasted him and the two ended up in a bloody, civil war, which caused Mario to be exiled in Africa. Later called back to Rome, he was re-elected for the seventh time as a Consul, but only days after his confirmation as such, he died in Rome, due to a heavy fever. His statue is still standing in the beautiful town of Arpino.

CHEF'S CORNER:

SOUR CREAM COFFEE CAKE



INGREDIENTS and INSTRUCTIONS

1/2 cup butter
1 cup sugar
2 eggs

Cream the above together.

ADD 1 cup sour cream and 3 tablespoons milk, 1 tsp vanilla and mix well.

SIFT TOGETHER & ADD 2 cups flour, 2 tsp, baking powder, 1 tsp baking soda

FILLING: 1/2 cup brown sugar, 3/4 cup chopped walnuts, 1 tsp cinnamon, 1 tsp cocoa Mix all together.

Put 1/4 of the batter into 2 greased and floured loaf pans: put 1/2 the filling in each pan, then fill with the rest of the batter evenly. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 min.

OR YOU can make 1 bundt cake by putting some filling in a bundt pan. Pour 1/2 the batter and the rest of the filling then the batter. Bake at 350 for 45 min. Turn cake out upside down when cool.
