

# PAESE DEL MESE



The sandstone hill overlooking the Sacco valley on which Arnara rests seems to have given origin to the name of this small town, which in Roman times was a quarry from which was extracted porous rock or tufo for building purposes. During the war against the Papacy for the conquest of the Roman Duchy, the Longobard King Astolfo took possession of Arnara for its excellent strategical and defensive position in his effort to control the Via Latina, the ancient artery which connected central Italy with southern Italy. Astolfo was responsible for the construction of the so called "Torre Longobarda" in 756 A.D. Over the remains of this tower there was subsequently built an 11th century castle followed by a series of square turrets (ca. 15th cent.) of which only one remains (the others having been incorporated within successive building projects). Only one circular shaped turret was built and is still visible today. In 1167 the town was invaded and destroyed by the Normans. Subsequently, Arnara belonged to the earldom of the Counts of Ceccano until 1450. The town then passed over to the Colonna, the feudal princes of Salerno, vassals of the Holy See. Thanks to its favourable geographical position, Arnara's territory is rich with vineyards (Sangiovese, Trebbiano, Malvasia, Maturano, Pamparano and Moscato), Arnara's wine is available in most outlets and restaurants as "vino della casa" (house wine). Abitanti: 2157; Altitudine: 250m s.l.m.; Piatti tipici: arrosto misto di carne con patate, gustosi antipasti misti.

La collina di origine sabbiosa e arenaria ove sorge, pare aver ispirato il nome di questo paesino della Ciociaria; era un'antica cava romana di tufo, usato come materiale edilizio. Durante la guerra contro il Papato per la conquista del Ducato Romano, il re longobardo Astolfo prese possesso della collina di Arnara per l'ottima posizione strategica e lì costruì la Torre longobarda (756 d.C.) per controllare la via Latina, punto di congiunzione fra l'italia centrale e quella meridionale. Sui resti della torre fu costruito il Castello (XI sec.) e successivamente una serie di torri quadrate (XV sec. circa), di cui una sola oggi è visibile (le altre sono inglobate nelle case), ed un'unica torre circolare (visibile presso la casa delle Suore del Preziosissimo Sangue). Nel 1167 il paese fu invaso e distrutto dai Normanni. A seguito di questo evento, Arnara appartenne al Feudo dei conti di Ceccano fino al 1450. Arnara passò poi ai Colonna, principi di Salerno. Grazie alla buona posizione geografica, Arnara è una zona ricca di vitigni (Sangiovese, Trebbiano, Malvasia, Maturano, Pamparano e Moscato). Il vino arnarese, venduto alle cantine Sociali, si trova in molte trattorie ciociare con il nome comune di "vino della casa". Abitanti: 2157; Altitudine: 250m s.l.m.; Piatti tipici: arrosto misto di carne con patate, gustosi antipasti misti.

# FIGLI ILLUSTRI



### **ARTURO CIACELLI**

Futurist Painter, born in Arnara, may 28, 1883; died in Venice, July 6, 1966. Introduced to artistic work by his father, a mosaicist, he studied first at the Academy of France and at the Academy of Fine Arts in Rome, where he graduated; then, with U. Boccioni and G. Severini, he attended the evening courses in industrial art

at the Incurabili. He took part in the Salone dei Rifiutati (1905) and in 1907, together with Bozzani and Cambellotti, he worked as a set designer for some of D'Annunzio's works. He spent long periods abroad, dividing his time between Paris and Scandinavia, bringing with him the signs of the new futurist research, even if with a strong symbolist accent. From his compositions of the 1910s, mostly abstract, emerges his interest in the study of dynamism, plastic syntheses and simultaneity. Later he also interpreted in this direction the poetics of aeropittura, developed on the example of Balla, both for the iridescence of the colours and for the presence of sinuous forms that overlap and interpenetrate on the canvas.

Pittore Futurista, nato ad Arnara il 28, Maggio 1883; mori' a Venezia, il 6, luglio 1966. Introdotto dal padre mosaicista al lavoro artistico, studia prima all'Accademia di Francia e a quella di Belle Arti a Roma, dove si diploma; poi, con U. Boccioni e G. Severini, segue i corsi serali d'arte industriale degli Incurabili. Partecipa al Salone dei Rifiutati (1905) e nel 1907 insieme a Bozzani e Cambellotti svolge attività di scenografo per alcuni lavori di D'Annunzio.

Trascorre lunghi periodi all'estero, dividendosi tra Parigi e i paesi scandinavi, portandovi i segni delle nuove ricerche futuriste, anche se di forte accento simbolista. Dalle sue composizioni degli anni Dieci, in gran parte astratte, emerge l'interesse per lo studio del dinamismo, delle sintesi plastiche e della simultaneità. Successivamente interpreta in tale direzione anche la poetica dell'aeropittura, sviluppata sull'esempio di Balla, sia per l'iridescenza dei colori, sia per la presenza di forme flessuose, che sulla tela si sovrappongono e si compenetrano.
